Where: **Alpena, Michigan.** The location is the Alpena Combat Readiness Training Center at Phelps Collins Air National Guard Base, just seven (7) miles west of Alpena on Highway M-32.

Cost: \$150 for All CAP Members, Cadet Airmen through Senior Colonel.

How: Application Procedures.

After 10 June 2004: Applicants should send an email or leave a phone message stating their name, home state, and contact number. Then hand-carry your application and check to Alpena. Remember to include the ten-dollar late fee.

Late Fee and Refund Policy: Cancellations or no-shows and any associated refunds will be assessed a \$10 handling fee subtracted from the amount refunded. Applications received after the deadline will be assessed a late fee of an additional \$10 for a total of \$160. **Refunds will not be given after 01 AUG 04.**

Scholarships: Partial or complete scholarships are available for cadets who cannot afford the cost of encampment. **No cadet should miss the encampment for financial reasons.** Please contact Lt. Family Discounts: CAP is a family oriented organization. We are proud to be able to offer activities for every member of the family. To support this, we will offer the following discounts for members of the same family: One Member - \$150 each, two members - \$140 each, three or more - \$130 each. Please pay on one check or money order and please note all family member names.

Cadets who have NOT previously attended an encampment may apply for:

Basic Cadet Training. Encampment is designed for cadets to experience a week of living on a military base, learn teamwork, self-discipline, and interact with other CAP cadets. Cadets get to apply leadership skills previously learned, meet military personnel at their jobs, and tour government facilities and aircraft. Each cadet will receive a CAP Cadet Orientation Flight. The week closes with competition in the Final Morning Inspection and Flight Drill Competition. The Cadet Party follows on Friday night. The Graduation and Awards Ceremony will take place Saturday morning. Graduation certificates, Honor Flight trophies and Outstanding Cadet awards will be presented. The Pass-In-Review Parade Ceremony will follow, weather permitting. Parents and guests are welcome to watch the graduation and parade. Dismissal will be after the barracks buildings are returned in acceptable condition, no earlier than 1300 hours (1:00pm).

Attendance at an encampment is required before any cadet may earn the Mitchell Award. Cadets who attend an encampment in their first year of membership have a higher degree of success in the Cadet Program and are more likely to remain in the program than those who do not attend encampment.

The cost is \$150.00. This includes room and board but not transportation. Car-pooling is recommended. Plan to arrive between 0800 hours and 1000 hours on Saturday the 26th. **ANYONE planning to arrive before 0800 on the 26th MUST gain prior approval from the Encampment Commander, Lt. Col. Ed Phelka, at encampment@glr.cap.gov**

Cadets who have previously attended an encampment may apply for:

1. Great Lakes Region Cadet Leadership School

This advanced course is designed to improve the leadership skills of cadets who have previously attended an Encampment. The focus of the course is teamwork, with emphasis on time management, instructional techniques, and attention to detail. Students who complete the course will receive Region Leadership School credit, required for the Eaker Award. Applicants **must** have completed **Achievement 5** prior to 26 June 04 in order to be eligible to attend. CLS Candidates must apply by **10 June 2004**; this deadline will be strictly enforced. A homework assignment will be mailed out prior to encampment. Walk-ins will NOT be accepted for Cadet Leadership School. Cost of Cadet Leadership School is the same as the basic encampment, \$150.00. 2. Great Lakes Region Encampment 2004 - Alpena - Model Rocketry Encampment

This is a pilot program, with attendance limited for the first year. The Rocketry Encampment will provide advanced aerospace education opportunities to the participants. The program will incorporate the CAPR 50-20, providing the cadet with the opportunity to complete and earn the rocketry badge/pin. Additionally, and more importantly, cadets will be exposed to educational and career opportunities in the field. It will be held during the Basic Encampment, and Rocketry cadets may participate in some activities with the Basic cadets. The Rocketry cadets will be expected to conform to the Basic S.O.P., function as their own flight, and to participate in Pass and Review exercises. It is hoped that by including senior member AEO's, that the rocketry program may be taken back to squadrons. If this proves to be a successful program, it could be expanded to an annual event and with increased attendance. For the first year, however, attendance will be limited. First year attendees that demonstrate interest will be considered for staffing in future events. Interested cadets should contact Capt Betty Dumont (dumontfamily@peoplepc.com) for more information.

3. Air Operations Support

Air Operations are always a major part of the GLR Encampment. In order for basic cadets to receive Orientation Rides, a great deal of ground support is needed. The Air Operations section is looking for approximately ten highly-motivated, responsible cadets to work in the Operations section during encampment. Duties may include assisting with scheduling, aircraft tracking, flight planning, ground handling, and assisting with pre-flight and safety inspections. Cadets will be led by a flight commander, and will participate to the extent possible with the basic encampment during Evening PT and the graduation / Pass-In-Review ceremonies. Senior Member Opportunities

1. Senior Member Staff Positions Are Still Available.

Senior members (both male and female) are needed for Tactical Officer positions for each cadet flight. 2. Senior Member Training Opportunities

All courses are subject to a minimum registration of 8 students per class. Senior members attending senior training all week pay only the \$150 dollar encampment fee.

- **Air Force Institute for Advanced Distance Learning (AFIADL) 13 Clinic** – Formerly known as ECI 13, this CAP Officer's Course (by correspondence) is required for the Certificate of Proficiency and promotion to Captain. This class will run 28-June - 1 July 2004 from 1300-1700, Monday through Thursday. Attendees must enroll with the AFIADL and order the end-of-course exam by 01 JUN 04. Bring your test materials to encampment for an exam on Friday.
- **Aerospace Education Program for Senior Members (AEPSM) Clinic** – A review session designed to assist Senior Members in studying toward the AEPSM exam, and the Brig. Gen. Chuck Yeager Award. *Dates to be announced.* Bring your AEPSM book.
- **Squadron Leadership School (SLS)** Designed to enhance a senior member's performance at the squadron level and to increase understanding of the basic function of a squadron and how to improve squadron operations. (Prior completion of Level 1 is required). Course is scheduled for 28-29 June 2004. SLS Cost: \$50. If you stay for the entire week, the cost is \$150. Contact the course director, Capt. Betty Dumont, at 231-775-4594 (dumontfamily@peoplepc.com) for additional information.
- **Emergency Services School** - Still in the planning stages, this school will expose senior members to the various aspects of Civil Air Patrol Emergency Services. Course work may include CPR / First Aid training, base staff functions, communications, ground search techniques, and applicable CAP Regulations governing Emergency Services. Applicants must have at least a General ES 101 Card. Check the Encampment Web Site for updates at <http://glr.cap.gov/encampment>.

Senior training plans are based on demand. If there is insufficient demand or applicants the course offerings may be reduced. 

AF Style Blues Uniform

- ◆ One (1) Flight Cap with Cadet Insignia
- ◆ One (1) Light Blue, short sleeve Shirt w/Wing Patch
- ◆ One (1) Uniform Trousers/Slacks/Skirt
- ◆ One (1) Belt w/Silver Buckle
- ◆ CAP Insignia (Grade and "CAP" Cutouts) (same set for BDUs)
- ◆ All Earned Ribbons and devices, all earned badges and insignia (wings, GTM badge, etc.)
- ◆ Blue, CAP Nameplate

Battle Dress Uniforms (BDUs)

- ◆ Two (2) BDU Shirts with approved patches and insignia (No Ranger tabs or badges). All officer rank SEWN on.
- ◆ Two (2) pair BDU Trousers
- ◆ One (1) Belt w/black open face buckle
